


WHY READING EARLY MATTERS:

Children in middle- and high-income homes have an average of 13 books per child. Children living in poverty have an average of **1 book per 300 children.**' PCIL is doing its part in changing this statistic.




2019 Book Distribution by Age


1,247 total graduates in 2019

Children growing up in homes with at least twenty books get three years more schooling than children from bookless homes, independent of their parents' education, occupation, and socioeconomic status.²




HOW PCIL IS HELPING:

HOW CAN YOU HELP?

Donate:

There are an estimated **26,731 eligible children in Pulaski County** who could be receiving free books through PCIL to get a head start on their education. Our goal is to serve at least 80% of these children. We are currently **only able to serve a maximum of around 12,000 children with our current budget** and each book costs only \$2.10 through the Imagination Library. We **need every cent** in order to help reach every child eligible.

Children served in 2019 should receive an **average of 33 books** before they turn five.
